It was especially difficult for Cassandra to convince them, because there weren't Greek names for the things she foresaw, so she had to simply transliterate them into Greek.

Connect each invention to its Greek equivalent, using a thick, dark line. **Words with a (2) after them connect to two other dots.** After you finish connecting all the dots, fold the paper so that it makes a "mountain" on each solid printed line and a "valley" on each dashed line. **Then view the paper at an angle from both top and bottom. Each direction will spell a different word when the "mountains" line up.**
