Paper Magick

The trees from which paper is made are affiliated with three of the four elements—earth, air and water. Add fire, and the cycle is complete. Magick has a long history of taking commonly available items and utilizing them to focus the will of the spell-caster. Simple, common paper has taken on that role, helping casters to read between the lines of reality.

Color Meanings

- White:** Purity, Protection, Sleep
- Red:** Sexual Love, Strength, Danger, Stamina, Charity
- Orange:** Stimulation, Encouragement, Attraction, Kindness
- Yellow:** Joy, Comfort, Persuasion, Charm,
- Green:** Luck, Fertility, Energy, Envy
- Blue:** Tranquility, Understanding, Health, Sincerity, Truth
- Indigo:** Depression, Impulsiveness, Ambition, Dignity
- Violet:** Tension, Power, Piety, Passion, Sentiment
- Pink:** Peace, Good Health, Devotion
- Gold:** Money, Confidence, Control

Shape Associations

- Many symbols can be used to express a spell-caster's will. Five must be included in any paper magick ritual. They are:
- Circle:** Defines intent
 - Square:** asks blessing of earth
 - Diamond:** asks blessing of air.
 - Triangle (up):** asks blessing of fire
 - Triangle (down):** asks blessing of water
