Historical Penmanship **SOLUTION**

1. Across from the Detention Bar at Kenney School is a collage of old school worksheets. (First photo in the set.) There are a bunch of old penmanship worksheets, and each have a code in the corner – B557, B533, etc. Thus, each “B number” maps to a letter. (Example: The first clue is B557, which maps to the letter N.)
2. The intro text encourages an examination of the wall of WWII heroes in the front hall of Kennedy School. (Last photo in set.) As hinted by the instructor's name in the puzzle, you find each relevant person by the first letter of their last name, then use the first letter of their first name to build the answer word. To find each relevant person, find the person in the row (given with each “B number”) whose last name starts with the letter found in part one. (Example: The first clue is B557, which maps to the letter N. The first clue tells one to look at the 15th row. The only person with a last name starting with N in the 15th row of the WWII plaque is “Noyes, Don.” Thus, the first letter of the answer is “D”.)
3. Repeating the steps before (and taking the second letter as I, a given) the answer word is DISASSEMBLE.
