

Pan-Alphabetic Gargle Blaster

4¶ **P**Gargle Blaster has been banned on almost every civilized world, although it is quite easy to obtain on the uncivilized ones if you have sufficient Altarian dollars. Various off-record statements suggest it may also be found in Las Vegas, America, Earth, Sol 3, but the jury is out as to whether this monkey-descended world, but no exacting citations can be found confirming this. Allegedly, events that occur within Las Vegas are confined to that locale.

5¶ **D**On the savage planets, among the speakeasies or brothels, a midwifist, surgeon, or veterinarian can craft a Gargle Blaster for you. For a price. If & only if you have a physician's signature, which they are more than happy to prescribe. For a price. Just tell them you have vague but agonizing pain that prevents you from working & that requires treatment.

6¶ **O**Experiments tell us that all back-alley medics will happily take buyer's cash. They may even serve up a Gargle Blaster. Frequently, because the ingredients heft such a high price tag, they may serve a faux Gargle Blaster. Beware fakes. Buy-by-mail litmus test kits are available that can affirm a Gargle Blaster's authenticity but be warned that many such kits are created by the same fraudulent back-alley medics that sell the fake Gargle Blaster in the first place. Still, such a great buzz can be had via a fake Gargle Blaster that many bars and ERs brazenly sell fakes at a reduced price. When purchasing a fake Gargle Blaster, stick with the ER. 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7¶ Legends and archives show a precursor of our modern drink originally recorded in an early Wesazoic era cave drawing and recipe. Hieroglyphs and scrolls among jars of liquid show a complex drink of amazingly similar design made using less-rare compounds. Unsurprising, given hyperdrive was unavailable.

8¶ Current-era hipsters — unhappy with carbon, nitrogen, oxygen, or ununpentium footprints (or tentacleprints) — revel in the antique ways of mixing the prototypical Pan Galactic Gargle Blaster.
