

## Making Contacts solution

The first + last names are homophones for a phrase that makes sense as the job title. For example, The Lead Litigator is SUSAN WYNNS... because the Lead Litigaotor SUES AND WINS.

Use the floor number to extract one letter from the homophone (10 for “sues and wiNs” = N)

The numbers in parentheses next the the title are the number of letters in the homophones (“sues and wins” is 4,3,4).

Here are all the name pairings and phrases:
